We express our gratitude and appreciation to all those confreres who served at Asha Jyothi and especially the present director Fr. Alwin and Fr. Felix for their dedicated service.

Activities of Sanskruti

In a significant move, around 300 Islamic and non-Islamic scholars from India, Saudi Arabia and South Africa met in Hyderabad on June 18 and took umbrage to the terror unleashed by ISIS, describing it as a "terror outfit not even remotely associated with the idea of Islam". Fr. G. Lazar SVD representing the Indian Christian Scholars' Forum presented a paper on "Islam and Violence Today" on this occasion. "The deeds and actions of ISIS are absolutely un-Islamic and against humanity" a resolution adopted by the congregation at the end of a three-day international seminar on "Life and ways of Prophet Mohammad". This international seminar was organised by AI Mahadul Aali AI Islamic, a centre for training and preparing

graduates of Islamic seminaries for higher learning. Scholars from Saudi Arabia like Dr. Alghamdi (World Islamic League, Saudi Arabia), Dr. Sheikh Mohammed Abdal fromUmmul Qura University, Mecca, Maulana Abbas Ali Jeenah and Maulana Ibrahim Bham from South Africa, Maulana Syed Mohammed Wali Rehmani, secretary, All India Muslim Personal Law Board, Maulana Rafi Qasmi, general secretary of the Jammat-e-Islamic Hind were among those who participated in the seminar.



The Ramzan spiritual conference has been an annual feature for the last few years, attracting faithful from different parts of Hyderabad. The prayer meet held on July 3 at Nizam College grounds, billed as one of the largest Ramzan congregations of the twin-cities, This prayer meeting was led by Sayyid Ibrahim Khaleel Al Bukhari, chairman of the academy. In his message to the congregation, Sayyid Bukhari called upon the faithful to restrain from all activities that smack of terrorism and extremism and strive for unity and social harmony of the country. He also said believers should act as the ambassadors of peace and tolerance which are the basis of Islam and urged them to use social media for good causes. Fr. G. Lazar SVD while addressing the congregation said that every Ramzan festival must be a tool to unite people, not to divide them, a way to love and bring harmony in the country. He also urged the youth not to become tools in the hands of anti-social elements in society.
