Dear confreres,

Through our prayers, expression of our feelings and through various means today, we stand in solidarity with the people of Japan tested by natural calamities and looming nuclear threat and with the people of Middle East experiencing war situations and civil unrest. Undoubtedly, these events might have become the feeder for the doomsayers on the one hand about the destiny of this universe and on the other hand, for the people who never say die, these events may still offer plenty of opportunities to build a better future. Time and again, the predictions of the doomsayers have turned out to be wrong and the latter seems to have the last laugh as they are the Easter people who find hope



in hopeless situations and add life to life. They give a concrete witness to the truth that every death leads to resurrection and every pain becomes the cause of gain.





Objectives of this Workshop:

- To promote or make VIVAT known among members
- To create National VIVAT (VIVAT INDIA) by establishing a core group in India
- To identify one or two issues as lobbying points or focus for would-be VIVAT team in India
- To make VIVAT members develop a sense of ownership over VIVAT
- To make individual members feel that they belong to, and, thus, could receive support and protection from VIVAT as they go about advancing JPIC concerns and working with the grassroots
- To learn that VIVAT serves as a tool of JPIC
- As UN-accredited NGO, VIVAT is something that gives members legal framework and recognition for their service to the poor and the marginalized
- To use VIVAT as an effective means to lobby for systemic policy change and structural transformation in the society.

NAGOYA STATEMENT 2011

SVD ASPAC BIBLICAL APOSTLATE (BA) COORDINATORS' ASSEMBLY

Nagoya, Japan, 16-22 March 2011

Seventeen confreres from SIN, JPN, KOR, VIE, PNG, AUS, IDE, IDR, IDJ, INC, INH, INM, and ING, the Generalate Coordinator of the Biblical Apostolate, Fr. Lukas Jua and the ASPAC Zonal Coordinator, Fr. Bill Burt, participated in the Assembly. Fr. Jua gave the key-note address, "Biblical Apostolate at the Service of Interculturality". He also gave a presentation on Pope Benedict XVI's exhortation "Verbum Domini". Fr. Burt, in the absence of BA Zonal Coordinator, chaired the Assembly. Unfortunately representatives from the Philippines were unable to attend.

The Assembly took place just a few days after a violent earthquake and tsunami caused great havoc in the north east of Japan. While Nagoya itself was not directly affected, the disaster was very much in the minds and prayers of all.

The purpose of the Assembly was threefold:

- > to share experiences in the Biblical Apostolate,
- > to formulate an action plan at the zonal level,
- > to contribute to the 2012 General Chapter theme.

The reports from all over the Zone that were tabled and presented are evidence of the vitality of the Biblical Apostolate in ASPAC. They show that in every province and region the Bible truly is at the heart of our lives as SVDs and in the diverse forms of our mission. We recognized though, that interculturality still needs to be enhanced in our communities (ad intra).

Reviewing the statement of the previous ASPAC BA Coordinators' Assembly held in Baguio, Philippines 2007, it was felt that generally we have been faithful to the commitments made by the Coordinators at that meeting. These commitments reflect our determination to witness to the Word in the spirit of prophetic dialogue in practical ways. Here in Nagoya three areas of BA ministry were identified:

- > Education, formation, research
- > Pastoral, liturgical
- > Social.

In line with current SVD mission from the four categories of dialogue partners we identify youth as our preferential dialogue partner in ASPAC. We then decided to focus our common ASPAC BA action plan on "Sharing Intercultural Life and Mission with the Youth of ASPAC". Different groupings of provinces and regions were given the task of developing specific modules regarding youth ministry in their areas, each in accord with their circumstances. These must be put into practice by the respective provinces and regions. They must be reviewed and evaluated. A time

frame for this process was set:

March 2011 - June 2012 : Preparation of modules and implementation at the local level.

June 2012 - March 2013 : Review, evaluation and sharing throughout the Zone.

March 2013 - March 2014 : Final draft of modules to be presented at the next BA Zonal assembly.

The focus of AUS and JPN will be on secular Youth, the India Subzone on Hindu Youth, the Indo-Leste on Muslim Youth, PNG and KOR on Protestant Youth, VIE on Buddhist and Communist Youth, SIN on technoculture Youth, and the Philippine Subzone on the poor and marginalized Youth. For the action plan of these groups from March 2011 to June 2012 please see the minutes.

By committing ourselves to implementing this zonal action plan, we hope that we can make a significant contribution to the 2012 General Chapter theme. The future of the world is in the hands of the youth. We, the ASPAC BA Coordinators turn to the youth as our partners, sharing in the intercultural life and mission of the People of God in Asia Pacific.

In conclusion, we thank the Provincial of Japan, Fr. Hideaki Ichise and all our SVD – JPN hosts for their hospitality and support. At this time of suffering and national uncertainty due to the natural disaster, Japan Province's willingness to be of service to us has been exemplary.

CIRCULAR ON THE GLOBAL FINANCIAL CRISIS AND SVD

Dear Fr. Provincial,

Two and a half years ago, in Circular Letter S01/2008, we enjoined all confreres to prepare ourselves for the effects of the global financial crisis and to reflect on the question of financial self-reliance and the way we finance our mission. We said in our letter that, specifically, we foresaw a suspension of subsidies for major capital outlays (Subsidy C in our distribution system, e.g., land purchase, building construction or renovations, purchase of expensive machineries, equipment or vehicles) and a reduction of subsidies for ordinary and extraordinary operational needs (Subsidy A and Subsidy B in our distribution system).

We are thankful to Divine Providence for sparing us the full effects of the crisis in the last two years. We are relieved that the measures so far taken by the public and private sectors worldwide have succeeded in preventing the crisis from getting worse and are succeeding in stimulating economic recovery globally.

However, aware that it takes time for the crisis to affect ordinary households, we have been uncertain as to our capability to distribute funds for the needs of our provinces/regions/missions worldwide. At our final deliberation on the 2011 March distribution, we felt more than at any previous time the effects of the crisis. The funds available for distribution were 14% lower than last year. Thus, we could approve only 61% of the subsidy applications. In other words, we were constrained to suspend subsidies for capital investments (Subsidy C, only 19% of requests could be approved) and to reduce substantially subsidies for operational needs (Subsidy A and B, only 75% of requests could be approved).

We do not foresee any significant improvement of this situation in the coming years. There are even signs that the situation may become worse. Therefore we urge you to revisit your province/region/mission's self-reliance plan (cf. Circular Letter P04/2007) and take concrete steps to implement it seriously.

We write this letter in the liturgical season of Lent during which we are invited to enrich our lives - in the words of Pope Benedict XVI - not with money that disappears and is nothing, but with the Word of God that is stable as the heavens and is reality. As we bear the pain of reduced subsidies and being constrained to do more with the little we have, we seek to strengthen our reliance on Divine Providence and to have more faith in local generosity for the needs of our mission commitments. As our confreres and communities live with less material resources and more in keeping with our vow of poverty, we hope to become living witnesses to the gospel values we proclaim and to the Suffering Servant we have chosen to follow.
