appreciated. This was indeed a golden opportunity to learn more about the Society in this Zone. This was a fruitful gathering and more sharing took place in the interaction among the participants.

We congratulate our confreres who are given responsibilities in the Zone for coordination and to make our Society effective in its missionary endeavours to the people of Asia and Pacific regions.

ASPAC Formators' Assembly - 2011

Thirty three SVD formators and 1 SSpS from the various SVD Formation Houses of the ASPAC Zone gathered in Tagaytay, Philippines from 17-21 October 2011 to identify and discuss the emerging challenges in SVD formation, and recommend concrete measures which we ourselves can adopt to respond to such challenges. Fr. S. Kulandaisamy participated in the Assembly from our province. Rev. Fr. Antonio Pernia SVD presented the results of the research study of General Consultor Fr. Robert Kisala SVD on the phenomenon of departures and early returning missionaries. Fr. Thomas Malipurathu SVD, the General Secretary for Formation and Education highlighted the state of Formation in SVD today and stressed the need to review and modify our formation programs in the light of the new understanding of mission as prophetic dialogue. Listening to the reports on various issues and concerns of the different formation houses, and sharing our insights on them, the following challenges and directives for action were identified:

Challenges to SVD Formation

- The decreasing trend in brother vocation.
- In multi-cultural formation houses, the dynamic complexities of communion and communication in intercultural or multicultural life; in homogenous communities, the lack of opportunities for growth into intercultural life and the difficulty of constituting an international community due to government restrictions.
- Lack of professional evaluation mechanisms to adequately assess the suitability and adaptability of candidates to the SVD religious-missionary life.
- The sad phenomenon of departures and early returnees among the young generation of SVD

missionaries due to insufficient readiness to enculturate and inability to face disappointments and vocational crisis.

Directives for Action

- 1. Brotherhood and Recruitment: We shall take personal initiatives to promote vocation to brotherhood by animating/strengthening our brothers in their identity and mission, their accomplishments and contributions to the Society; by forming common vocation animation teams of brothers, clerics and SSpS sisters; by promoting the desire of our brothers to be professionally equipped in their SVD mission.
- 2. ASPAC solidarity: It can be enhanced by encouraging our formandi to go for OTP, CCTP, CTP, or ESP; by considering a common formation house for ASPAC beginning with a joint postulancy or Novitiate programme; by updating ourselves with the dynamics of intercultural communication and inviting experts to give conferences on the subject to our formandi; encouraging our provincial superiors to share or exchange personnel within the zone on a long-term or short-term basis like formators, professors, retreat facilitators; by sharing

- our formation program with one another, etc.
- S. Professional standards: We shall seek assistance of lay experts in establishing professional norms and standards (psychological tests) in our recruitment process, animating the vocation journey of formandi. We could encourage the formators to take up courses on integral human development and by identifying potential formators among our formandi.

4. Departures and early returnees:

Acknowledging with gratefulness that about 85% of our missionaries remain faithful in their mission assignments, it was stressed that we should provide our formandi with strong religious-missionary motivations with a special emphasis on the new understanding of our SVD mission today and enable them to enculturate, persevere in difficulties and transcend vocational crisis.

The assembly ended on an encouraging note that challenges are nothing but opportunities for us to recommit ourselves to the noble mission carried out by the SVDs across the globe and to keep reminding ourselves that His mission is our mission.

DECISIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SVD FORMATION BOARD, INDIA

September 12-13, 2011, Arnold Bhavan, Hyderabad

The SVD Governing Board for Formation, India met on the 13th September 2011 at Arnold Bhavan, Hyderabad. Fr Nicholas Martis SVD, the chairperson of the SVD Formation Board, India chaired the session. The Board deliberated on the issues and proposals emerged from the two-day annual meeting of the Advisory Council of the SVD Formation Board, India held on the 12th and 13th of September 2011 at the same venue. After a long deliberations, the Board has arrived at the following decisions and recommendations:

- 01. In the admission and training of adult vocations to our Society, each candidate needs to be given due consideration individually, depending on his background. It is recommended that consultations with the respective Provincial Superior and the Formation Secretary precede the admission of such candidates.
- 02. Recognizing the importance of spiritual direction in our formation program, provision should be made in all our formation houses for spiritual directors, either appointed by the provincial

- administration or arranged by the head of the formation house.
- 03. The National Formation Secretary will make available a panel of resource persons, who could be contacted for conducting classes / seminars / workshops for our formees at all stages of formation.
- 04. A renewed attempt will be made to study the dropouts from our seminaries and vocational trends to our Society in India. A new committee consisting of Fr. Maria Michael SVD as its convener, Fr. Ronald Pereira SVD, Fr. Pushpa Anbu SVD and Fr. Michael Cherian SVD as its members will make the study and submit its report by 31st January 2012.
- 05. The Formation Board, India reminds that all our formation houses make / revisit their Vision Mission Statements at the beginning of the triennium.
- 06. The Provincial administration will evaluate the formators of the Province in the second half of the first year of its triennium.

- 07. The Formation Secretary will make available a common format of affidavit for obtaining the parental consent of the candidates recruited to our Society.
- 08. The Formation Secretary will organize a workshop for formators in 2012-13.
- 09. Appreciating the gift of brotherhood, the Formation Board, India reiterates that the brother candidates be given pertinent orientation and guidance at the initial stage of their formation.
- 10. A minimum financial contribution of Rs. 2,000.00 from our minor seminarians and Rs. 3,000.00 from our college going seminarians be collected every year beginning from June 2012. However, exceptions may be made for deserving cases.
- 11. Reading and responding to the signs of the times:
- (a) Our formation houses should address appropriately issues like gender sensitivity, pedophilia, ecology, corruption, migration, ethnocentrism, etc.
- (b) The JPIC coordinators in each province will assist our formation houses in addressing JPIC related issues.
- (c) Every formation house will take interest in meaningfully observing national / international days such as Girl Child Day, Women's Day, Environment Day, Brotherhood Day, etc.

- 12. It is highly recommended that all our minor seminaries employ professional English teachers to teach English to our seminarians. Concerted and creative efforts must be made to enhance their proficiency in English language even after their Juniorate.
- 13. A committee consisting of Fr. Gregory Arockiam, SVD as its convenor, Sr. Shalini SSpS, Fr. Prashant Lukose SVD, Fr. Callisto Gomes SVD and the Formation Secretary as its members will work out a syllabus on Arnold Janssen Spirituality for our formation houses.
- 14. The Formation Board, India urges that a decent dress code befitting our status be followed in our formation houses. It also insists that all our conferes in formation wear cassock for community liturgical celebrations.
- 15. The Formation Board, India highly recommends that all our seminarians obtain Unique Identity card (UID) / Adhaar during the academic year 2011-12.
- 16. The next annual SVD Formation Board, India meeting will be held at Atma Darshan, Mumbai on the 18th and 19th of September 2012.

REPORT OF THE SVD INTER PROVINCIAL GOVERNING BODY MEETING

September 14,, 2011 Arnold Bhavan, Hyderabad, India

The Governing Body of the Indian SVD, comprising of the Provincial Superiors & Regional Superior of the 4 Indian Provinces & one Region and the National Mission Secretary met at Arnold Bhavan, Hyderabad on Wednesday, 14th September, 2011. This was preceded by the annual Inter Provincial Planning Forum, comprising of all the Provincials & Regional together with their Council members and the Secretaries/ Coordinators of various Commissions. The meeting was presided over by Fr. Lazar Stanislaus SVD - the Chairperson of the SVD Governing Body, India. The Inter Provincial Planning Forum discussed on issues related to the mission involvements of the SVD in India in various fields. The Coordinators of the various National Commissions presented the consolidated reports of the activities undertaken by Confreres in their respective Areas in all the Provinces. The Governing Body deliberated on the outcome of the discussions in the Forum Meeting and arrived at the following decisions,

recommendations and guidelines.

1. Education Policy for the Society of the Divine Word in India:

Having studied the Education Policy drafted by the Committee set up for this purpose in the Inter Provincial Planning Forum, the Governing Body highly appreciated the Committee's hard work and diligent attention to all the details. The Governing Body recommends that this document should be studied by all the Confreres in the Education Ministry in their respective Provinces & Region. The responses received from each Province/Region with the suggestions and proposed amendments together with the proposed corrections by the Planning Forum will be given to the drafting committee to be studied and incorporated into the final draft.

2. VIVAT INTERNATIONAL - INDIA:

The Governing Body is in favour of constituting VIVAT INTERNATIONAL - INDIA. The

members of this Body are the members from India in VIVAT International. The board members of this body are President, Vice-President (Chairperson of JPIC, SVD and SSpS Provincials), Executive Secretary, Assistant Executive Secretary (JPIC national coordinators of SSpS and SVD) and members (all the JPIC provinicial/Regional coordinators of SVD and SSpS, OMI and ASC). This structure would function according to the Vivat International structure in its leadership roles.

- 2.a. The Governing Body endorses the following proposals as priority areas of action for Vivat International India:
 - Constitutional Rights of Dalit Christians
 - Rights of domestic workers, child labour & migrant workers
- 2.b. The Governing Body endorses the proposal that all Provinces & Region draw up and follow specific Insurance & domestic workers' policy.
- 2.c. The Governing Body recommends that Human Rights & other JPIC related issues could be introduced in our Educational Institutions.

3. Communication:

- a. The Governing Body decides that SVD National Communication Board takes membership of SIGNIS INDIA.
- b. The Governing Body reiterates that Social Communication be taught in all our Formation Houses with due seriousness.
- c. The Governing Body observes that there is a need to revive the commitment of each Province Communication Coordinator to feed data and information to the National Communication Coordinator regularly for updating the SVD India Website.

4. Biblical Apostolate:

- a. We need to address the Christian youth and youth of other Faiths for harmonious living by enabling them to recognize the Word of God in every religion. Hence we engage them in inter religious prayer service & dialogue.
- b. The proposed Biblical seminar for SVD confreres will be organized in March 2012.

5. Arnold Janssen Spirituality:

 We urge that every SVD Community/House/ Parish/Institution/School has visible signs of

- our Saints such as the bust of Arnold Janssen, posters, sayings etc.
- b. The Governing Body recommends that the AJS Province/Region Teams be trained adequately.
- c. To disseminate Arnold Janssen Spirituality among the lay faithful we urge Lay Associate Groups be formed in our Institutions/Parishes.

6. SVD Worldwide Mission:

We strongly feel the need to promote worldwide mission concept in India to generate mission interest and mission support. We recommend that efforts be made to raise funds in all our parishes/institutions for the SVD Mission cause. The respective Province/Region Mission Secretaries will forward the amount thus raised to the National Mission Secretary who in turn will communicate to the Generalate.

7. Environmental Concerns:

Being aware of the importance of the Environmental concerns, the Governing Body recommends the following action plan to be implemented in all our Schools/Parishes/Formation Houses:

- a. "No to Plastic"
- b. Rain water harvesting
- c. Tree plantation
- d. Develop habit of energy/power saving
- e. Celebrate Environment Day every year on 5 June
- 8. A seminar for Inter Provincial Planning Forum members will be organized in concurrence with the annual Inter Provincial Planning Forum meeting in 2012
- 9. Every year Brotherhood Day (October 4) be celebrated in an appropriate way in all our Houses/Parishes/Institutions.
- 10. The Governing Body decides to bring out a booklet of deceased confreres who served in India and of deceased confreres of Indian origin.
- 11. There is an urgent need to have documentation of every SVD venture & ministry in every Province/Region.

The Governing Body decided that the next Formation Board, Commission meetings and Inter Provincial Planning Forum will be held from September 17 - 21, 2012 at Atma Darshan, Andheri, Mumbai.
